



IMPORTANT INFORMATION TO KNOW WHEN RECEIVING FINANCIAL AID

Confidentiality:

Confidentiality is critically important. You shall not share the fact that you are applying for or receiving financial aid. Also, you shall not communicate the specifics about the amount of your award. Please know that if it is perceived that you have shared this confidential information, the application process will be terminated and any award given will be withdrawn. You are welcome to share that you are aware that PA offers financial aid and direct them to the PA website and the Admission page.

Communication:

All communication regarding financial aid will be delivered by email. Thus, it is critically important that you provide Clarity and PA with any changes in your email address. Any questions regarding your application and the uploading of required documents should be directed to Clarity.

Payments:

You must be current and remain current on all school financial obligations and failing to do so will jeopardize the receipt of current and/or future aid, and may result in financial penalties that will be added to your current obligations. Financial aid may be withdrawn if satisfactory academic standing is not maintained by my child and constructive community citizenship is not maintained by me or my child. If my household income changes or you acquire new assets valued at more than \$10,000 (a car is an example) you agree to notify Pulaski Academy's Financial Aid office.

Renewal:

Financial aid is awarded on a year-to-year basis and your application for aid must be submitted to Clarity by the stated deadline for each school year. Receiving financial aid in any school year shall not obligate the school to provide aid in any succeeding year.

You are obligated to notify Clarity of any change of address, telephone numbers, cellular phone numbers, and especially, email addresses. However, I understand that aid may not be awarded to students who are accepted conditionally or on probation.

Other Considerations:

The student receiving aid shall be subject in all respects to the regulatory and administrative policies of the school. If in the opinion of the school administration the student's conduct at school or away from school is unacceptable to the school administration, or the student's academic progress is unsatisfactory, the student may forfeit his/her financial aid award.

A positive working relationship between faculty/administration and parents/guardians is crucial for a student's successful educational experience. If such a relationship cannot be maintained, PA reserves the right to end its relationship with the family and rescind the remaining portion of his/her financial aid award.
